The King has been pleased to order a congé d'elire to pass the Great Seal, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Lincoln to elect a Bishop of that See, void by the translation of the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor George Tomline, late Bishop thereof, to the See of Winchester; and his Majesty has also been pleased by his royal sign manual, to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor George Pelham, now Bishop of Exeter, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Lincoln.
