MEMORANDUM.

The King has been pleased to approve of the authority, granted in the Gazette of 13th March 1819, for the word "Talaria" being borne on the colours and appointments of the 9th regiment of foot being cancelled, and of the regiment being permitted to bear on its colours and appointments the words "Roleia" and "Vimiera," in consideration of the distinguished conduct of the 2d battalion of the 9th regiment at the battle of Roleia, on 17th August 1808, and at Vimiera, on 21st August 1808.

SEPTEMBER 23, 1820.
