## WHITEHALL—MARCH 5, 1821.

Yesterday morning, soon after one o'clock, died, at the age of twelve weeks, her Highness Elizabeth, only daughter of his Royal Highness the Duke of Clarence, to the great grief of his Majesty and of all the Royal Family.

64th—Lieutenant William O'Neill, from the 58th foot, to be Lieutenant, vice Stevenson, who exchanges.

67th—Bernard Gornley, late Serjeant-Major in the regiment, to be Quartermaster, vice Hennessy, deceased. All dated February 22.

79th—Lieutenant Thomas Beckham, from the 89th foot, to be Lieutenant, vice Archibald Cameron, who exchanges; dated February 15.

88th—Lieutenant Honourable Charles Napier to be Captain; by purchase, vice Christie, who retires. Ensign John Gibson to be Lieutenant, by purchase, vice Napier. Gentleman Cadet William Codrington, from the royal military college, to be Ensign, by purchase, vice Gibson. All dated February 22.

89th—Lieutenant Archibald Cameron, from the 79th foot, to be Lieutenant, vice Beckham, who exchanges.
