CARLTON-HOUSE-MARCH 21, 1821.

This day his Excellency the Duke de Frias and Uceda, Ambass dor Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the King of the Spains, had a private audience of his Majesty to deliver a letter from his Sovereign; to which he was introduced by Lord Viscount Castlereagh, his Majesty's Principal Se-cretary of State for Foreign affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knight, Master of the Cemonies.
