WHITEHALL—April 18, 1821.

The King has been pleased to appoint Doctor Andrew Duncan, sen. to be First Physician to his Majesty in Scotland, in the room of Doctor Gregory, deceased.

WESTMINSTER—April 19, 1821.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by his Majesty, for declaring his Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An act for altering and amending the laws of excise, for securing the payment of the duties on beer and ale brewed in Great Britain.

An act for fixing the rates of subsistence to be paid to innkeepers and others on quartering soldiers.

An act to extend certain provisions of an act of King William the Third, intituled, "An act for regulating of trials in cases of treason and misprison of treason," to that part of the United Kingdom called Ireland.

An act to consolidate an act for making and repairing the road leading from the North Queensferry, in the county of Fife, to the city of Perth, and to the town of Dunfermline, with an act for making and repairing certain roads in the counties of Fife, Kinross, Perth, and Clackmannan.

And to several English and one Irish road, &c. acts, and four private bills.
