CARLTON-HOUSE—NOVEMBER 14, 1821.

This day the Baron de Nicolay, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Emperor of all the Russias, had a private audience of his Majesty, to deliver his letter of recall; to which he was introduced by the Marquess of Londonderry, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.
