DUBLIN-CASTLE—DECEMBER 29, 1821.

The Marquess Wellesley, who embarked at Holyhead at ten o'clock A. M. the 28th instant, arrived in the harbour of Howth at five o'clock the same evening; and this day his Lordship, upon entering Dublin, was received by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, Sheriff, and Commons of the city of Dublin.

His Lordship, attended by a squadron of dragoons, proceeded to the Castle; and the Council having assembled at two o'clock, was introduced in form to his Excellency Earl Talbot, who received him sitting under the canopy of state in the presence-chamber, from whence a procession was made in the usual state to the council-chamber. The Council sitting, his Lordship's commission being read, and the oaths administered to him, his Lordship was invested with the collar of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, and received the sword of state from the Earl Talbot.

His Excellency afterwards repaired to the presence-chamber, and received the compliments of the nobility and other persons of distinction upon his safe arrival, and taking upon him the government of Ireland.

FOREIGN-OFFICE—JANUARY 1, 1822.

54th—Assistant-Surgeon George Leich, from half-pay 6th royal veteran battalion, to be Assistant-Surgeon, vice Shanks, whose appointment has not taken place; dated December 20.

55th—George Lawrence, gent. to be Ensign, by purchase, vice Jackson, who retires; dated October 24.

61st—Ensign Henry Johnson Cotter, from the 90th foot, to be Lieutenant, by purchase, vice Wolfe, promoted.

63d—Gentleman Cadet William Smith Sewell Doyle, from the royal military college, to be Ensign, by purchase, vice Lord Falkland, appointed to the 71st foot.

67th—Captain Charles Wyndham, from the 2d life guards, to be Major, by purchase, vice Cassidy, who retires.

71st—Ensigns Anthony Robert L'Estrange to be Lieutenant, by purchase, vice Peel, promoted in the 2d West India regiment. Lucius Cary Viscount Falkland, from the 63d foot, to be Ensign, vice L'Estrange.

HOSPITAL STAFF—To be Hospital-Assistants to the Forces—Hospital-Assistants Frederick Farmer, from half-pay, vice Coleman, appointed to the 40th foot. Peter Stewart, from half-pay, vice Gillespie, appointed to the 90th foot. Both dated December 20, 1821.

MEMORANDA.

The appointment of Lieutenant Beamish, from half-pay, to be Lieutenant in the 4th dragoon guards, as stated in the Gazette of the 17th November, has not taken place.

The appointment of Lieutenant Ware, from the 89th foot, to be Lieutenant in the 14th foot, as stated in the Gazette of the 17th November, should be vice Thomas Jenour, who retires upon half-pay 93d foot, instead of Jenour, dismissed the service.
