WESTMINSTER—MAY 24, 1822.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by his Majesty, for declaring his Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

- An act for the employment of the poor in certain districts in Ireland.
- An act for repealing the duties on plain silk net or tulle, and for granting new duties in lieu thereof.
- An act for altering and amending several acts, passed in the first and ninth years of the reign of King George the First, and in the 41st, 52d, 56th, and 57th years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Third, so far as the same relate to the recovery of damages committed by riotous and tumultuous assemblies and unlawful and malicious offenders.
- An act for erecting a bridewell for the county of Lanark and city of Glasgow.
- And to several English and Irish acts.
