WESTMINSTER—JULY 1, 1822.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by his Majesty, for declaring his Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An act for apportioning the burden occasioned by the military and naval pensions and civil superannuations, by vesting an equal annuity in Trustees for the payment thereof.

An act to repeal certain tonnage duties of Customs on ships or vessels.

An act to extend the period allowed to persons compounding for their assessed taxes, and to give further relief in certain cases therein mentioned.

An act concerning the residence of Sheriffs-Depute of the counties of Edinburgh and Lanark.

And to one English and four private acts.
