THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, accurating them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by his Majesty, for declaring his Royal Assent to se-veral Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An act to regulate the manufacture and sale of scorched or roasted corn, peas, beans, or parsnips, and of cocca paste, broma, and other mixtures of cocca.

An act to repeal the rates, duties, and taxes payable in re-spect of fire-hearths and windows in Ireland, and to exempt
