This day Baron Langsdorff, Minister Resident from their Royal Highnesses the Grand Duke of Baden, the Elector, and the Grand Duke of Hesse, had an audience of his Majesty to deliver his credentials from his Royal Highness the Grand Duke of Baden; to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable George Canning, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

The King was this day pleased to invest Vice-Admiral Sir Thomas Boulden Thomson, Bart. and Vice-Admiral Sir Harry Neale, Bart. with the ensigns of a Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, respectively.

His Majesty was also pleased this day to invest Major General Sir William Keir Grant with the ensigns of a Knight Commander of the said Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath.

The King was this day pleased to confer the honour of Knighthood on John Hullock, Esq. one of the Barons of his Majesty's Court of Exchequer.
