**LORD CHAMBERLAIN'S OFFICE, JANUARY 13, 1824.**

The Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household has appointed Lieutenant-Colonel Charles Dashwood, Groom of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Chamber in Ordinary, in the room of Frederick Chapman, Esq. deceased.

**FOREIGN-OFFICE, JANUARY 15, 1824.**

The King has been pleased to appoint the Honourable Frederick Cathcart (now Secretary to His Majesty's Embassy at St. Petersburg) to be His Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary to the Diet at Frankfort.
