PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This day the Right Honourable Sir Robert Gifford, Knight, Lord Chief Justice of the Court of Common Pleas; and the Right Honourable Sir William Alexander, Knight, Lord Chief Baron of the Court of Exchequer, were, by command of His Majesty, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took their respective places at the Board accordingly.
