SECOND TERM INTIMATION

TO THE CREDITORS OF

The deceased Lieutenant-Colonel JOHN ALEXANDER BANNERMAN of Lethindy, lately Governor of Prince of Wales' Island.

IN the Process of Sale and Ranking at the instance of JAMES BANNERMAN, Esq., in the Civil Service of the Honourable East India Company, eldest lawful son and apparent heir of the said Lieutenant-Colonel John Alexander Bannerman, and his attorney, against his said Father's Creditors, (with which the Process of Multiplepoinding and Exoneration, at the instance of William Macdonald, Esq., of St. Martins, and others, against said Creditors, has been conjoined) Lord Cringletie, Ordinary, on the 24th day of February 1824, pronounced the following interlocutor.—“Assigns the first sederunt day of May next, for the second term to the whole Creditors of the said Lieutenant-Colonel John Alexander Bannerman to produce and lodge in the clerk's hands all their claims, rights, and diligences competent to them respectively against the said Lieutenant-Colonel John Alexander Bannerman, or his estate, and the whole vouchers thereof; with certification, that what writs shall not be produced, shall be held as false and forged, in as far as they may affect the said Lieutenant-Colonel John Alexander Bannerman's estate, and the interest of the Creditors therein, who have, or shall produce their rights and diligences affecting the same; and appoints intimation to be given to all parties concerned, in the Edinburgh Gazette, weekly, for three successive weeks, and in the minute book, immediately following the date of this interlocutor.” Of which Intimation is hereby made to all concerned accordingly.
