FOREIGN-OFFICE, APRIL 13, 1824.

The Right Honourable George Canning, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received His Majesty's commands to signify to the Ministers of Friendly and Neutral Powers, residing at this Court, that the necessary measures have been taken, by command of His Majesty, for the blockade of the port of Algiers, and that from this time all the measures, authorized by the Law of Nations, will be adopted and executed, with respect to all vessels which may attempt to violate the said blockade.

WHITEHALL, APRIL 10, 1824.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Honourable the Earl of Morton, K. T. to be His Majesty's High Commissioner to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.
