The King was this day pleased to confer the honour of Knighthood upon Dr. Augustus West, Brevet Deputy Inspector of Hospitals in the British Service, one of the Physicians in Ordinary to His Most Faithful Majesty the King of Portugal, Brazil, and the Algarves, and Knight Commander of the Royal Portuguese Military Order of the Tower and Sword.
