WESTMINSTER, April 11, 1826.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An act to repeal two acts of the Parliament of Scotland relative to assault and battery pendente lite.

An act for enabling the Glasgow Gas Light Company to raise a farther sum of money for the use of their works, and for other purposes relating thereto.

And several English and Irish, and three private acts.
