And the Creditors are hereby required to produce in the Trustee's hands their claims, and vouchers or grounds of debt, with their oaths of verity thereof, at or previous to the said first meeting, if not already produced; certifying, that unless the said productions are made, betwixt and the 21st February 1827, being ten months after the date of the sequestration, the parties neglecting shall have no share in the first distribution of the estate.
