THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

The Federal Government is a system of government that is organized into three branches: the Executive, the Legislative, and the Judicial. Each branch has its own powers and responsibilities, and they all work together to govern the country.

The Executive branch is headed by the President and is responsible for enforcing the laws. The Legislative branch is made up of the House of Representatives and the Senate, and it is responsible for making laws. The Judicial branch is headed by the Supreme Court and is responsible for interpreting the laws.

The Federal Government also has a system of checks and balances to ensure that no one branch becomes too powerful. For example, the President can veto laws passed by Congress, but Congress can override a veto with a two-thirds majority. The Supreme Court can declare laws unconstitutional, but Congress can change the Court's composition.
