WESTMINSTER, April 2, 1827.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

- An Act to enable His Majesty to make further provision for their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Clarence.
- An Act for continuing to His Majesty, for one year, certain duties on personal estates, offices, and pensions in England, and also certain duties on sugar imported into the United Kingdom for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven.
- An Act for more conveniently paying the pensions of widows of Officers of the royal marines.
- An Act to repeal an Act, of the twenty-eighth year of His late Majesty, for the better regulation of the manufacture of ounce thread.
- An Act to continue, until the twenty-fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, an Act of the fifty-fourth year of His late Majesty, for rendering the payment of Creditors more equal and expeditious in Scotland.
- And one Irish, several English, and three private Acts.
