The King, as Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, has been graciously pleased, by letters patent under his royal sign manual, and the great seal of the Order; bearing date respectively the 10th day of May instant, to dispense with all the statutes and regulations usually observed in regard to installation; and to give and grant unto George William Frederick Duke of Leeds; William Spencer Duke of Devonshire; and Brownlow Marquess of Exeter, Knights Elect of the said Most Noble Order, and duly invested with the ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to Knights Companions of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, in as full and ample a manner as if they had been formally installed, any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.
