THIS day the Right Honourable James Abercromby and the Right Honourable Robert Wilnot Horton were, by His Majesty's command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took their respective places at the Board accordingly.

LORD CHAMBERLAIN'S-OFFICE, May 25, 1827.

ORDERS for the Court's going into mourning, on Sunday next the 27th instant, for His late Majesty the King of Saxony, viz.

The Gentlemen to wear black, full trimmed, fringed or plain linen, coloured swords and buckles.

Undress—Grey frocks.

The Court to change the mourning on Sunday the 10th of June next, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk or velvet, coloured ribbons, fans and tippets, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuffs, with black ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured swords and buckles.

And on Sunday the 17th of June next, the Court to go out of mourning.
