**T**HE King, as Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, has been pleased, by letters patent under his royal sign manual and the Great Seal of the Order, to dispense with all the statutes and regulations usually observed with regard to installation; and to grant unto His Imperial Majesty Nicholas the First, Emperor and Autocrat of All the Russias, Knight of the said Most Noble Order, and duly invested with the ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to a Knight Companion of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, in as full and ample a manner as if His Imperial Majesty had been formally installed, any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.
