HE King has been pleased to order a congé d'elire to pass the Great Seal, empowering the Archdeacon and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Landaff to elect a Bishop of that See, void by the translation of the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor Charles Richard Sumner, late Bishop thereof, to the See of Winchester; and His Majesty has also been pleased to recommend the Reverend Edward Copleston, Doctor in Divinity, to be elected by the said Archdeacon and Chapter, Bishop of the said See of Landaff.

The King has also been pleased to recommend the Reverend Edward Copleston, Doctor in Divinity, to be chosen into the place of Dean of the Cathedral Church of St. Paul, London, and also to be elected and admitted into the place of Canon Residentiary of the said Cathedral Church, the same being void by the translation of the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor Charles Richard Sumner, late Bishop of Landaff, Dean and Canon Residentiary of the said Cathedral Church of St. Paul, to the See of Winchester.
