First Commissioner of His Majesty's Treasury; the Right Honourable Henry Goulburn, Chancellor of His Majesty's Exchequer; the Right Honourable Thomas Baron Wallace; the Right Honourable John Sullivan; Anthony Ashley Cooper, Esq. (commonly called Lord Ashley); the Right Honourable James Graham (commonly called Marquess of Graham); and Lawrence Peel, Esq. His Majesty's Commissioners for the Affairs of India.

The King has been pleased to appoint Vice-Admiral Sir William Johnstone Hope, G. C. B.: Vice-Admiral the Right Honourable Sir George Cockburn, G. C. B.; Sir George Clerk, Bart.; and George Charles Pratt, Esq. (commonly called Earl of Brecknock); to be Members of the Council of His Royal Highness the Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom.
