PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS day the Right Honourable Sir Christopher Robinson, Knt. was, by command of His Majesty, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

St. JAMES'S PALACE, March 6, 1828.

The King has been pleased to appoint the Earl of Warwick and the Earl of Roden, Lords of His Majesty's Bedchamber, in the room of the Earl of Delawarr and the Earl of Errol, resigned.

DUBLIN-CASTLE, March 1, 1828.

The Marquess of Anglesey, who embarked at Holyhead on Friday morning the 29th of February, on board the *Escape* steam-vessel, arrived in Kingstown Harbour at seven o'clock yesterday evening. His Lordship, on his arrival in Dublin this day, was received by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, Sheriffs, and Commons of the City of Dublin. His Lordship, attended by a Squadron of Dragoons, proceeded to the Castle, and the Council having assembled at three o'clock, was introduced in form to their Excellencies the Lords Justices, who received him sitting under the Canopy of State in the Presence Chamber, from whence a pro-

cession was made in the usual state to the Council Chamber; the Council sitting, his Lordship's commission was read, and the oaths being administered to him, his Lordship was invested with the collar of the Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick, and received the Sword of State from the Lords Justices.

His Excellency afterwards repaired to the Presence Chamber, and received the compliments of the Nobility and other persons of distinction upon his safe arrival, and taking upon him the Government of Ireland.
