HIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do de-sire the immediate attendance of the Honourashor House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for raising the sum of sixteen millions and forty-six thousand eight hundred pounds by Exchequer Bills, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight.

An Act to amend the Acts for regulating the reduction of the national debt.

An Act to repeal an Act, passed in the third year of His present Majesty, for apportioning the burthen occasioned by the military and naval pensions and civil superannuations, by vesting an equal annuity in trustees for the payment thereof.

An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs.

An Act to amend an Act for the amendment of the law respecting pilots and pilotage, and also for the better pre-servation of floating lights, buoys, and beacons.

An Act to continue an Act for amending and consolidating the laws relating to the abolition of the slave trade.

An Act for remedying a defect in the titles of lands pur chased for charitable purposes.

An Act to amend the Acts for regulating turnpike roads. And several English, Irish, and two private Acts.
