HE King has been pleased to order a conge d'elire to pass the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Chester to elect a Bishop of that See, the same being void by the translation of the Right Reverend Father in God Charles James, late Bishop thereof, to the See of London; and His Majesty has also been pleased, by His royal sign manual, to recom-mend to the said Dean and Chapter the Reverend John Bird Sumner, Doctor in Divinity, to be by them chosen Bishop of the said See of Chester.
