DOWNING-STREET, Jan. 30. 1797.

FFICIAL accounts have this day been received from Mr Robert Craufurd of the furrender of Kehl, on the 10th instant, to the Austrians, after a siege of forty-nine days. It appears, that from the 31st of December to the 7th of January several attacks had been made by the Austrians upon the enemy's principal out-works, in all of which the former were completely fuccessful.

Mr R. Craufurd speaks in the highest terms of the skill and perseverance of his Royal Highness the Archduke Charles, the gallantry and good conduct of Prince Frederick of Orange, and of the patience and chearfulness with which the troops submitted to the greatest hardships.

Copy of a letter from RICHARD ONSLOW, Efq. Vice-Admiral of the Red, to Mr Nepean, dated on board his Majesty's ship Nassau, Yarmouth Roads, Jan. 29. 1797.

Be pleased to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that his Majesty's hired armed cutter Griffin anchored in these roads yesterday morning at ten o'clock, with the French privateer lugger La Liberté, her prize, carrying three carriage guns, four fwivels, and eighteen men. She was taken at the entrance of the Ship-Wash, after a chace of three hours and an half. This is one of the vessels that has infested the coast for some time past. I am, Sir,
