WESTMINSTER, June 4, 1829.

**T**HIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to enable one or more of the Commissioners of Excise, to act for the dispatch of business for Scotland and Ireland respectively.

An Act for the more effectual punishment of attempts to murder, in certain cases, in Scotland.

An Act to enable the Edinburgh and Dalkeith Railway Company to raise a further sum of money to make a branch from the said Railway to Leith; and for other purposes relating thereto.

And several English, Irish, and four private Acts.

The King has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal, appointing Lieutenant-General Lord Robert Edward Henry Somerset, K. C. B. to be Lieutenant-General of the Ordnance of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.
