## THE AVERAGE PRICE OF SUGAR,

Computed from the Returns of the Quantities and Prices made during the Six Weeks preceding the 23d Feb.inst. and taken in the Manner directed by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the 32d Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Allowance of the Drawback and Payment of the Bounty on the Exportation of Sugar, and for permitting the Importation of Sugar and Cossee into the Bahama and Bermuda Islands in Foreign Ships," is

Sixty-four Shillings and Seven pence per Hundred Weight;

Exclusive of the Duty of Customs paid or payable thereon on the Importation thereof into Great Britain, which, by the Authority of Parliament, is directed to be deemed and taken as the Average Price of Brown or Muscovado Sugar, for the Purpose of regulating the Allowance of the Drawback on the Exportation of Sugar of the British Plantations, and the Payment of the Bounty on the Exportation of Refined Sugar, produced from Muscovado Sugar imported from his Majesty's Plantations in America.
