Extract of a letter from the Hon. Robert Storford, Commander of his Majerty's ship Phaeton, to Evan Nepean, Esq. dated Falmouth, the 9th of March 1797.

I Have to request you will inform their Lordships, that, on the 6th instant, Ushant bearing E. by W. forty-fix leagues, I captured a French privateer called L'Actif, a ship carrying 18 guns and 120 men; she sailed from Nantes on the 16th ult. and, on the 27th ult. captured the Princess Elizabeth packet coming from Jamaica, in lat. 40 deg. 30 min. long. 14 deg. 30 min. the only English prize she had made during her cruize. Several privateers were string at Nantes at the time that the L'Actif failed.
