

FOREIGN-OFFICE, November 12, 1830.

NFORMATION has this day been received by His Majesty's Government from His Majesty's Ambassador at the Hague, that, in pursuance of a Decree of His Majesty the King of the Netherlands, dated the 7th instant, the coast of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, belonging to the province of West Flanders, with the ports of the same, including those of Antwerp and Ghent, are declared to be in a state of blockade.

St. JAMES'S-PALACE, November 10, 1830.
