AT a meeting of the Creditors of the said William Clark, held upon the 5th instant, David Black writer in Brechin was elected trustee upon his sequestrated estate; and his nomination has since been confirmed by the Court of Session.

The trustee hereby intimates, that the Sheriff of Forfarshire has fixed Friday the 5th, and Friday the 19th days of May next, within the Town Court-room of Brechin, at 11 o'clock forenoon, for the public examination of the bankrupt, his family, and others acquainted with his business, in terms of the statute.
