The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IT is this day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that every Minister and Preacher, as well of the Established Church in that part of Great Britain called Scotland, as of the Episcopal Communion protected and allowed by an Act passed in the tenth year of Her late Majesty Queen Anne, c. 7, and intituled "An Act to prevent the disturbing those of the Episcopal Communion in that part of Great Britain called Scotland, in the exercise of their religious worship, and in the use of the Liturgy of the Church of England," and for repealing the Act passed in the Parliament of Scotland, intituled "An Act against irregular baptisms and marriages," do, during the continuance of that grievous disease with which several places in this Kingdom are at this time visited, at some time during the exercise of Divine Service in such respective church, congregation, or assembly, put up their prayers to Almighty God on account of such visitation, instead of the prayers put up in pursuance of His Majesty's Order in Council of the 2d November last.
