Copy of a Letter from Rear-Admiral Sir John Orde, Bart. Commanding Officer of his Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Plymouth, to Evan Nepean, Efq. dated the 13th of May

Herewith I transmit, for the information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a letter I have received from Captain Seymour, of his Majesty's sloop Spitsire, giving an account of his having captured La Trompeuse French schooner, which he has brought into this port.

SIR.

I have the honour to acquaint you of the capture of Le Trompeuse French schooner privateer (of Morlaix), of fix guns and forty men, out five days, and had only taken two Prussian vessels belonging to Embden; one bound to Liverpool, the other to Oporto. The Spitfire was present Sunday last at the recapture of a brig by the Unité.
