ST. JAMES'S-PALACE, February 22, 1833.

HE King was this day pleased to confer the honour of Knighthood upon Captain Richard Spencer, of the Royal Navy, Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, and Military Knight Commander of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order.

And Senor Don Manuel Moreno, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Republic of the United Provinces of Rio de la Plata, to deliver his credentials: To which audiences they were respectively introduced by Lord Viscount Palmerston, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

Queen's House, St. James's Palace, February 25, 1833.

This day Namik Pacha, Minister on a special mission from the Sublime Porte; and Senor Don Manuel Moreno, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Republic of the United Provinces of Rio de la Plata, had their first audiences of Her Majesty;
