DOWNING-STREET, June 8, 1833.

THE King has been pleased to appoint Major-General Sir James Carmichael Smyth, Bart. to be Lieutenant-Governor of British Guiana, comprehending the Colonies of Demerary, Essequibo, and Berbice.

WESTMINSTER, June 10, 1833.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by his Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to repeal the duties, allowances, and drawbacks of Excise on soap, and to grant other duties, allowances, and drawbacks in lieu thereof.

An Act for repealing part of an Act, of the twenty-sixth year of King George the Third, for better securing the duties on starch, and for preventing frauds on the said duties, and for making other provisions in lieu thereof.

An Act to amend the laws relating to dramatic literary property.

An Act to enable depositors in savings banks and others to purchase government annuities, through the medium of savings banks; and to amend an Act, of the ninth year of

His late Majesty, to consolidate and amend the laws relating to savings banks.

An Act for granting certain powers to a company, called the Imperial Continental Gas Association.

An Act for the better establishing and securing a fund for providing annuities to the widows and children of the members of the Faculty of Procurators of Glasgow.

An Act to enable the Edinburgh Life Assurance Company to sue and be sued in the name of their manager, secretary, or a limited number of their ordinary directors, to hold property, and for other purposes relating thereto.

An Act to enable the Economic Life Assurance Society to sue and be sued in the name of any one of the Directors or Trustees of the said Society.
