ADMIRALTY-OFFICE, September 18. 1797. Copy of a letter from Admiral the Earl of ST VINCENT, K.B. Commander in Chief of his Majefty's fleet on the coast of Portugal, to Evan Nepean, Esq. dated on board the Ville de Portugal of Coding the Cod of Annual Code de Paris, off Cadiz, the 21st of August, 1797.

THAVE this moment received the inclosed report from Cap-tain Downman, of his Majesty's sloop the Speedy, stating the capture of a Spanish privateer. I am, &c. ST:VINCENT:

MY LORD; Speedy, in the River Tagus, Aug. 16. 1797.

I HAVE the honour to acquaint you, that on the 1st inftant, twenty leagues S. W. of Oporto, we captured El Domini Lucas, a Spanish lugger privateer, of two four-pounders, twelve swivels and twenty-eight men, after a chace of five hours. She is new, had been out fixteen days, and had not taken any thing. I have the honour to be, &c.

Dryad, Cork Harbour, Sept. 12.1797.

I have to inform you, that on the 9th inflant, at eight P.
M. in latitude 50 deg. longitude 13 deg. we difcovered a fail to the S. E. At half with nine we came alongfide of her, after various manœuvres on her part to get away; the confequence of which was, I was under the necellity of firing feveral flot at her, which proved in the end her destruction; running along-fide of her for some time. frequently desiring of her to bring to, but without effect; when all of a sudden I heard a great noise from her, and was informed his vessel was on fire. Fearing the confequence of that, I sheered off a little, but soon found he was sinking, upon which Lordered him to run on board of us: was finking, upon which I ordered him to run on board of us; but I believe flie was then too far gone, as I perceived her to: fettle very fast, and in a few minutes she went down. I immediately hossed the boats out, though it blow fresh, and the sea. diately hoilted the boats out, though it blow frein; and the lear run high, and every exertion made on the part of the ship's company. I am forry to say we could only save seventeen, and them owing to the perseverance of my senior Lieutenant, Mr Palmer, and a sew seamen, in the launch.
