KYAN'S PATENT FOR THE PREVENTION OF DRY ROT, &c.—Notice is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session, for leave to bring in a Bill for confirming and for prolonging the term of certain Letters-Patent under the Seal appointed by the Treaty of Union to be used instead of the Great Seal of Scotland, for a new mode of preserving certain Vegetable Substances from decay, and bearing date the 9th day of July 1832, which were granted by His present Majesty King William the Fourth, to John Howard Kyan, of South Row, Euston Square, in the County of Middlesex, Esquire, for the term of 14 years from the date thereof, and for granting certain privileges in relation to the said Letters-Patent.
