Copy of a Letter from Captain LEWIS, of his Majesty's sloop Weazle, to EVAN NEPEAN, Esq. dated at sea, September 26, 1797.

I BEG to acquaint you, for the information of their Lordships, that I yesterday captured, off the Land's End, L'Entreprennant, French cutter privateer, which sailed from Morlaix on the 20th instant, carrying one four-pounder, some swivels, and twenty-three men.

She had taken on the 23d an English brig, the master and crew of which I found on board; and as there were three convoys in fight, I am happy to say she is prevented from further mischief.

Extract of a Letter from Sir PETER PARKER, Bart. Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels at Portsmouth, to EVAN NEPEAN, Esq. dated on board the Royal William, at Spithead, the 30th of September, 1797.

INCLOSED is a letter from Lieut. Thomas Newton, commanding the *Telemachus* armed cutter, giving an account of his having yesterday captured the *Jean Bart*, French lugger privateer.

Telemachus, Spithead, September 30, 1797.

SIR,

I HAVE the honour to acquaint you, that yesterday morning, off Portland, his Majesty's armed cutter under my command, after a chase of five hours, captured the *Jean Bart*, French lugger privateer, of eight swivels, coppered, and manned with twenty-four men; had been three days out of Cherbourg, and had taken nothing.

THE appointment of Thomas Adair, clerk to the signet, to be trustee on Mr Ross's sequestrated estate, having been confirmed by the Court of Session, he hereby gives notice, that the Sheriff of Edinburgh has fixed Monday the 23d of October current, and Monday the 13th of November next, at one o'clock afternoon, within the sheriff-clerk's office, Edinburgh, for the public examination of the bankrupt and his family;—as also, that the bankrupt being resident in England, Lord Cullen has, upon an application made to the Court of Session, appointed Thursday the 19th of October current, and Thursday the 2d day of November next, within the rules of the King's Bench Prison, for the examination of the said George Ross, the bankrupt, in England, and has granted commission to any of the Justices of Peace for the county of Surry to attend said examination, and take the bankrupt's oath.
