

Office of the Lord Chamberlain to the Queen, Queen's House, St. James's, February 16, 1836.

OTICE is hereby given, that it is the Queen's intention to hold a Drawing-Room on Thursday, March 24th, being for the celebration of Her Majesty's Birth-day.

No presentations can take place on the Birthday, but it is particularly requested that each Lady and Gentleman attending the Drawing-Room will bring three cards, one to be left in the Waitingroom, one to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting on the King, and the other to the Lord Chamberlain to the Queen, who will announce them to Her Majesty.
