Copy of Letter from the Right Honourable Lord BRID-FORT, K. B. to EVAN NEPEAN, Efq. dated on board his Majetty's ship Royal George, at sea, the 1st of October, 1797:

SIR I.THIS day fell' in with his Majesty's ship Unite, Captain Rowley, having under his protection the Indian, a French ship privateer of 16 guns, and the Egmont, one of the Leeward Island convoy, which were taken by the Phæton and Unité on the morning of the 24th ult. and herewith I transmit, for their Lordships information, a copy of Capt.
