And his Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable General Sir Charles Grey, Knight of the Bath, to be Governor of the illand of Guernfey, he this day took the oaths appointed to be taken by the Governor of that island.

Copy of Letter from the Right Honourable Lord BRID-FORT, K. B. to EVAN NEPEAN, Efq. dated on board his Majetty's ship Royal George, at sea, the 1st of October, 1797:

SIR I.THIS day fell' in with his Majesty's ship Unite, Captain Rowley, having under his protection the Indian, a French ship privateer of 16 guns, and the Egmont, one of the Leeward Island convoy, which were taken by the Phæton and Unité on the morning of the 24th ult. and herewith I transmit, for their Lordships information, a copy of Capt. Stopford's letter to me on that Subject.

Rhaton, off the Roches Bonnes, Sept. 24, 1797

MY LORD, I HAVE the honour to inform your Lordship, that the Indian, a French ship privateer of 16 guns, together with her prize the Egmont, a homeward bound; West Indiaman of 450 tons, were taken this morning; by the Phaton and Unité.
