FROM FRIDAY, Oct. 13, TO TUESDAY, Oct. 17, 1797.

Lieutenant Brodie, of the Rose cutter, arrived early this morning with a Letter from Admiral Doncan; Commander in Chief of his Majesty's Thips, &c. employed in the North Sea, to Evan Nepean, Esq; of which the following is a copy.

Venerable, off the coast of Holland, the 12th of October, by log (11th) three P. M. Camperdown E. S. E. eight miles, wind N. by E. SIR,

I have the pleasure to acquaint you, for the information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that at nine o'clock this morning I got fight of the Dutch Fleet; at half past twelve I passed through their line, and the action commenced, which has been very severe. The Admiral's ship is dismasted, and has struck, as have feveral others, and one is on fire.

I shall fend Captain Fairfax with particulars the moment I can spare him.

Extract of a letter from Admiral Sir Richard King, Bart. Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels at Plymouth, to Mr Nepean, dated the 11th instant.

I herewith transmit, for their Lordships information, a letter which I received this morning from Lieutenant Tomlinson, commanding the Speedwell lugger, giving an account of his having captured a French cutter privateer carrying 2 brass six pounders, 2 swivels and 18 men.

Speedwell, at fea, Oct. 10. 1797.

I have the honour to inform you, the Start bearing north about nine leagues, we fell in with, this morning, and, after a chace of fix house, captured Les Amies. Suall French cutter privatured Les Hantes, territories, having on board 2 brafs fix pounders, 2 fwivels, and 13 men; out four days from Granville, and had not taken any thing.

Extract of a letter from Capt. Roberts, Commander of his Majesty's ship La Concorde, to Evan Nepean, Esq. dated at Madeira, the 7th of Aug. 1797

Be pleased to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that at break of day on the 24th ult. (Cape Finisterre bearing S.E. by E. distant about 40 leagues) I fell in with and captured the brigantine Le Poisson Volant letter of marque, Captain Laterte, laden with wines and different kinds of merchandife, from Bourdeaux bound to Guadaloupe; the is pierced for 8 guns, but had only 4 on board, is new coppered, and was fitted out with the intention, after landing her cargo in the West Indies, to cruize in those seas as a privateer, where, from her superior sailing, she prohably would have done confiderable mischief, as she sails much better than the Concorde in light winds, and was taken by being fortunately within reach of our guns when first feen.
