TO THE CREDITORS OF ALEXANDER STALKER, Wright & Builder in Perth:

Charles Archer, wood-merchant in Perth, having been chosen trustee upon the sequestered estate of the said Alexander Stalker, and his nomination approved of and confirmed by the Court of Session, the Sheriff of Perth has, upon the application of the said trustee, appointed Thursday the 23d inst. and Saturday the 9th December next, in the Court-house at Perth, at 11 o'clock forenoon, for the public examination of the bankrupt, and others concerned with his affairs.
