C. B.; and Christian and Catharine Heron Douglas, spinsters, the only surviving younger children of the late Sir William Douglas, of Kelhead, Bart. deceased, by Grace his wife, eldest daughter and coheir of William Johnstone, of Lockerby, aforesaid, Esq. also deceased, and younger brothers and sisters of Charles now Marquess of Queensberry, Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, may have, hold, and enjoy the same titles, place, pre-eminence, and precedence, as if their late father, the said Sir William Douglas, had survived William late Duke and Marquess of Queensberry, of that part of the United Kingdom called Scotland, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Marquess of Queensberry.
