A DISPATCH has been received at this Office from Francis Coleman Macgregor, Esq. His Majesty's Consul at Elsinore, reporting an alteration to be made in Hammer Light-house, Island of Bornholm, of which the following is a Copy:—

SIR, *Elsinore, May 10, 1837.*

I have the honour of reporting to you, for the information of Viscount Palmerston, that, according to a notice given by the Central Board of Customs and Trade at Copenhagen, the coal-fire of Hammer Light-house, on the north point of the Island of Bornholm, is going to be converted into a fixed lamp-light; and that, in consequence, the necessary alterations in the lantern will be commenced in the month of June next, during the progress of which operation lamps will be lighted every night on the north point of the said Island, for the guidance of the shipping passing that way.
