Copy of a letter from Admiral Lord DUNCAN, Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels in the North Sea, to EVAN NEPEAN, Esq. dated the 25th inst.

SIR,

I herewith inclose, for the information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a list of the killed and wounded, on the 11th of October last, on board such of his Majesty's ships under my command, whose situations after the action prevented their returns being made, in time to be included in the one before transmitted. A list of killed and wounded on board such of his Majesty's ships under my command, who were in the action of the 11th of October last, and from whom no return was made before.

Montague—3 seamen killed; 2 officers, 2 seamen, 1 marine, wounded.

Director—6 seamen, 1 marine, wounded.

Monmouth—1 officer, 1 seaman, 2 marines, 1 boy, killed; 16 seamen, 2 marines, 4 boys, wounded.

Veteran—1 officer, 3 seamen, killed; 21 seamen, wounded.
