NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN,

THAT application is intended to be made to Parliament, in the ensuing Session, for leave to bring in a Bill for more effectually repairing and maintaining, and for improving, extending, and regulating the HARBOUR of the ROYAL BURGH of ABERBROTHWICK, in the County of Forfar, and for erecting and maintaining additional Piers, Quays, Jetties, Wharfs, Wet Docks, Basins, Bridges, Lighthouses, Warehouses, and other Works, in and adjoining to the said Harbour, and for improving and maintaining the approaches and means of Access thereto, both by Sea and Land: For acquiring and taking Lands and heritages, and other Property, for the purposes aforesaid; and for authorising the alteration, reduction, or increasing of the existing Shore-Tolls, Dues, Rates, or Duties, and the levying of Dock-Dues, Light-Dues, Tolls, or Rates, and such other Dues or Rates, as may be usual and necessary: For Watching, Lighting, and supplying with Water the said Harbour, Docks, and other Docks, and other Works, and the Vessels frequenting the same: And also, for establishing and maintaining a system of Police for the said Harbour, Docks, and other Works, and for making such Rules and Regulations connected therewith, as may from time to time be found expedient: For transferring the right and management of the said Harbour from the Magistrates and Town-Council of the said Burgh of Aberbrothwick, to, and vesting and placing the same, together with the said Docks and other additional Works, in certain Commissioners to be named in the said Bill, and for powers to such Commissioners to purchase the existing Harbour and Works therewith connected, license Pilots, and to regulate Pilotage Dues; and generally, for doing all matters and things necessary for accomplishing the purposes aforesaid; which said Harbour, Docks, and other Works are, or are intended to be, situated in and adjoining to the Parish of Aberbrothwick, and in the Ladyloan and Abbey Parishes of Aberbrothwick, all in the County of Forfar; in reference to which said Works and Improvements, a Map or Plan, with sections and book of reference, containing list of Owners or reputed Owners, Lessees or reputed Lessees, and Occupiers, will be lodged with the Sheriff-clerk for the County of Forfar, at his office in the Town of Forfar, on or before the 30th of November, in this present year 1837, in terms of the standing orders of Parliament.
